This year, to keep the event as safe and fun as possible, we ask that parents bring their children to enjoy the parade at the following times:

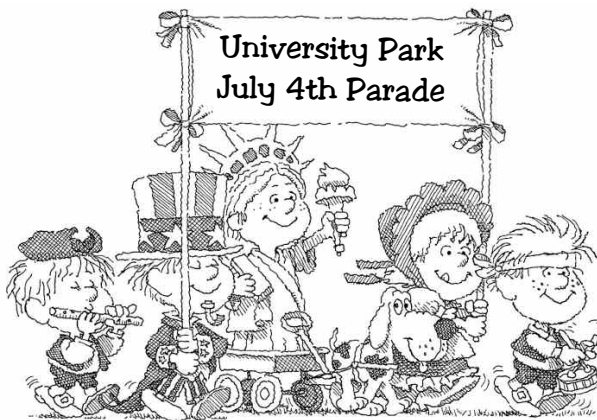
*10-10:15 Little Sparklers ride the bike route (Ages 0-5)

Please be sure to observe these times to ensure that our littlest parade participants have an opportunity to fully and safely experience the fun of being in the parade. Parents, please supervise your children to ensure that everyone has a good time at this great event!

In addition, the University Park Mom's Club will be selling hotdogs and drinks as well as giving out free popsicles again this year. Please be sure to stop by their booth. All proceeds from the sales of hotdogs and drinks will be donated to a local neighborhood food pantry. The food pantry serves 100 families per week. For every \$100 dollars donated, the pantry provides one month's worth of food to the families in need. Also please note that the produce grown in our neighborhood garden at Observatory Park is donated to the food pantry.

The Mom's Club needs volunteers to help run the booth during the event as well as for setup and takedown. They will be sending out a signup genius in the next week with shift times so please sign up.
